PROTOCOL
AMENDING THE CONVENTION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT
OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN
IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF
NORWAY PROVIDING FOR THE RECIPROCAL RECOGNITION
AND ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS IN CIVIL MATTERS,
SIGNED AT LONDON ON 12 JUNE 1961

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Norway;

Desiring to amend the Convention providing for the Reciprocal Recognition and Enforcement of Judgments in Civil Matters, signed by the Contracting Parties at London on 12 June 1961⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention");

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

A new paragraph shall be added to Article II of the Convention, as follows:

"(4) A Contracting Party shall not be obliged to apply the present Convention to any judgment given in respect of injury or damage, wherever it has occurred, being of a description which is the subject of a convention with respect to civil liability in the field of nuclear energy to which one of the two Contracting Parties is also a Party."

ARTICLE 2

This Protocol shall be subject to ratification. Instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at London. The Protocol shall enter into force one month after the date on which the instruments of ratification are exchanged and shall thereupon form an integral part of the Convention.

In witness whereof the undersigned, being duly authorised thereto by their respective Governments, have signed this Protocol.

Done in duplicate at Oslo this thirteenth day of October 1971, in the English and Norwegian languages, both texts being equally authoritative.
